Important components of this program are helping vets transition into permanent housing elsewhere in the community and maintaining employment. # Our Friends, The Wisconsin Union

In early 2018, Porchlight Board Member, Ron Luskin, approached the University of Wisconsin-Madison's student union and Wisconsin Union (WU) with a proposed partnership that was both innovative and multifaceted in its approach. This proposal stems from the desire of the Wisconsin Union Directorate to focus on their social justice mission. This partnership includes three main components: our Porchlight Products program, a student internship, and employment opportunities.



#### **Porchlight Products**

This partnership brought some exciting new opportunities for our job skills training program, Porchlight Products. For example, our locally-sourced sauerkraut from Porchlight Products was served at all brat stands in the Memorial Union Terrace. From May through August, we delivered approximately 50 pounds of sauerkraut each week, totaling over 838 pounds. Each batch of sauerkraut takes three weeks to ferment, so the Porchlight Products team was already hard at work by the end of March to ensure that plenty of product was ready for the hungry patrons when the weather got warm and the Terrace opened back up.

#### Internship

Additionally, this partnership allowed for a paid internship opportunity. It gives a University of Wisconsin-Madison student hands-on experience in the non-profit sector, while expanding their knowledge base for how this type of agency operates. We currently have our second intern who will be with us for the full

The final facet of our partnership with the Wisconsin Union includes the employment opportunities that were created for residents of Porchlight. Through the help of an agency called Employment Resources, Inc., a handful of Porchlight residents, many of whom have disabilities or disrupted work
